Plenary Assembly 2017

Preparations are in full swing for the 15-18 November 2017 gathering of our Members and Consultors for the Plenary Assembly with the theme The Future of Humanity: New Challenges to Anthropology.

The meeting will have sessions on Anthropological Foundations, Medicine and Genetics, Neurosciences, and Artificial Intelligence.

Personnel Changes

Bishop Barthélemy Adoukonou has completed his service as Secretary to the Dicastery and has now returned to Benin to become the director of the *Laboratoire d'anthropologie du sage intellectuel communautaire*. The Rome Half Marathon "Via Pacis" for Peace and Interreligious Dialogue took place Sunday, 17 September spreading the message "No to violence, No to racism, No to discrimination." Thousands of runners completed an ideal ring between St. Peter's, the Synagogue, the Mosque, Protestant and Orthodox churches and other Roman religious symbols, such as the Stadium and the Ara Pacis.

Music

The Acts have already been published of the international conference organized by the Dicastery 3-5 March 2017 titled *Church and Culture: 50 years after the Instruction "Musicam Sacram."* There were over 350 musicians, liturgists and pastoralists, composers and conductors, educators, musicologists, and theologians in attendance reflecting on the actual state of today's music all around the world.

Other Engagements of the Superiors

The President, Cardinal Ravasi visited Fatima (23-24 June) and Spoleto (8 July). He received a Laurea h.c. in jurisprudence from Reggio Calabria where the rectors of Italian universities gathered to promote a culture of legality and inaugurate the diocesan library and museum (6-8 September). He spoke about Odysseus and Abraham at the Courtyard of Assisi on the theme of Voyage and dialogued with the Italian Home Affairs Minister on the theme of immigration and welcoming (14-17 September).


The Delegate, Mons. Azevedo was keynote speaker at the Italian National Convention of the Association on Ecclesiastical Archivists and visited the Diocese of Beira, Mozambique where he delivered a study on Dom Sebastio Soares de Resende's Episcopal Munus and his contribution to the Second Vatican Council.

The Secretary Adjunct, Mons. Tighe gave a keynote address at the annual <u>Gathering of Pastoral</u> <u>Theologians</u> of German speaking countries in Augsburg (12-14 September) entitled "Sharing the Good News in a Digital Culture: Mission in a 'new continent'." He was a guest speaker at the annual conference of the Altius Society at Oxford (29 Sept-1 Oct.) with the topic of: *The Future of Communication*.

The Undersecretary, Mons. Sanchez de Toca attended the Sport at the Service of Humanity conference at Villanova University (7-8 July) and an anti-match fixing meeting in Rome (27 September). He organised and ran in the Rome Half Marathon VIA PACIS (17 September).

Visitors included a number episcopal conferences in *ad liminas:* Honduras (4 September), Nicaragua (11 September), Bolivia (18 September), Ecuador (28 September). Ambassadors of Lithuania, Italy and Russia, a representative of the Albanian Embassy, and the Head of the Chancellery of the Polish Prime Minister, Beata Kempa were also among visitors as were representatives of Scholas Occurentes, the mayor and the managers of the Chapecoenese futbol team, and the Argentina section of the Sport at the Service of Humanity Association.
