## **CHARITY AUCTION**

On May 20, in his first private meeting after lockdown, Pope Francis received representatives of **We Run Together**. These athletes had been due to host an event where the fastest would race with the slowest, and the strongest compete alongside the weakest in aid of the poorest.

During the meeting Cardinal Ravasi presented the Charity Auction, where these athletes and administrators are now channelling their energies, with many famous sports stars donating materials for auction.

68,000 Euros have already been gathered for hospitals in the northern Italian cities of Bergamo and Brescia.



The charity auction has been organized in conjunction with our partners Vatican Athletics, Courtyard of the Gentiles, the *Fiamme Gialle* and Fidal-Lazio.

Every ten days a batch of prizes is uploaded to the auction.

The series of auctions closes 8 August.
