The **IV International Music Conference** took place Feb. 4-5, 2021, on the theme “Church and Music: Texts and Contexts”. A video message from Pope Francis set the tone. Then, through a variety of cultural angles – translation, hermeneutics, form, language, inculturation, embodiment, liturgy and politics – input came from philosophers, theologians, musicologists, liturgists and protagonists of culture. The highlight of the online dialogue was a pair of reflections on the telling and healing possibilities of music in the grit of humanity from Cardinal Gianfranco Ravasi and philosopher Martha Nussbaum (see report in [Osservatore Romano](#)). The entire event was framed by extracts from Karl Reinecke’s op. 220 “Biblische Bilder”. The Acts and video highlights are currently being prepared.


